## Harrison graduate has African tour

An Oakland Community College student charged through zebra herds in a mini-van, shopped in native markets and climbed Mt. Kilimanjaro this past summer on a study-travel program based in Nairobi, Kenya.

David Silver, son of Dr. and Mrs. Robert Silver, 28806 Still Valley Drive, Farmington, took classes in African history, politics, geography and biology at the Kenya Science Teachers College. A 10-day safari preceded the three-week session, which was sponsored by the American Institute for Foreign Study, Greenwich, Conn.

The most rugged portion of the trip for David was a five-day climb of snow-capped Mt. Kilimanjaro. Af-

rica's highest mountain (19,340 feet). Students first trudged on mud roads past banana and coffee plantations, mingling with the friendly Chaga people who shouted "Jambo" (hello) to members of the expedition.

The climbers then encountered a muddy, root-infested path in a rain forest inside Kilimanjaro National Park. Two more days were spent going through bleak rolling hills covered with scrubby vegetation.

David and the others who reached the top received a garland of flowers and an engraved certificate. The climbers stayed in wooden huts but had guides and porters to carry supplies and prepare meals.

At school David, a graduate of Harrison High School, and 160 other American students lived in modern dormitories on the edge of Nairobi, capital of Kenya. Several afternoons were spent exploring and shopping in the city of 500,000, where David "bagged" a zebra-skin rug for his parents.

## Junior high is burglarized

FARMINGTON-Teachers returning to Farmington Jr. High this fall found the school was missing several hundred dollars worth of equipment from the shop and biology room.

Although the Farmington police have the burglary listed as a breaking and entering, their report indicates they could not find any signs of forced entry into any of the cabinets containing the items which were taken.

They said that the fact that it took place during the summer recess makes it difficult to pinpoint a time when the culprit may have entered the building.

Among the items taken were, assorted open wrenches, crescent wrenches, a drill set, sockets and attachments, assorted tap sets, vice grips, balance beams, \$120 worth of optics and assorted boxed and pipe wrenches.
