'Survey' a mixed show

"Survey," one of this season's major competitive, juried exhibitions of the crafts media in the Detroit area, will open to the public Tuesday at Cranbrook Academy of Art Museum, 500 Lone Pine Road, Bloomfield Hills.

The exhibition through Oct. 20 explores new directions in clay, fiber, metal and mixes media by artists from five Midwestern states: Michigan, Wisconsin, Ohio, Indiana and Illinois. Students, professionals and amateurs were invited by the museum to participate.

"Survey" is exhibited in conjunction with the Michigan Crafts Council Conference "The Crafts-

man Extended" and concurrently with Birmingham/Bloomfield Art Association's "Coastal Craftsman '74."

Juried by Helen Drutt, owner of the Helen Drutt Gallery, Philadelphia, and leading author on contemporary crafts history, awards were given to three artists: Richard DeVore, Cranbrook Academy of Art ceramics department head; Gerhardt Knodel, Cranbrook Academy of Art fiber department head; and Pat St. Cyr of Livonia, who is a fiber artist.

FROM APPROXIMATELY 650 objects submitted to the competition, Ms. Drutt chose 86, repre-

sented 20 artists. Included are Gordon Orear of Troy; John Glick of Farmington; and Katherine Kennedy of Bloomfield Hills.

Juried Drutt also is a 20th century crafts lecturer on the faculty of Philadelphia College of Art, out of which her gallery evolved; executive director of Philadelphia Council of Professional Craftsmen, which she helped form; and a member of the Philadelphia Museum of Art's Inter-Society Committee, 20th century decorative art and design.

Cranbrook Academy of Art Museum is open from 1 to 5 p.m. Tuesdays through Sundays, closed Mondays and holidays.

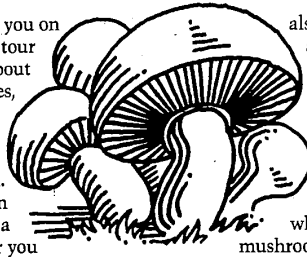
