Mobile home park zoning planned

SOUTHFIELD—City planners are sit-ting on a powder keg which may ex-plode when they unveil a proposed or-dnance creating a mobile home park district.

Also expected to arouse homeowner flak is a possible request for a mobile home park on 22 acres on the east side of Inkster Road between Ten and Eleven mile roads.

It is expected the ordinance will be acted upon before the planning commission considers any petition for a trailer park by developer Bernard Soble.

"A community must provide for various land uses," said Southfield City Planner Donald Gross.

"If we receive a request for mobile homes we must create an ordinance to control and regulate the district and assure proper use of the land."

The proposed ordinance is subject to revision and is not designed to fit or override Soble's petition. Gross said. The ordinance as now drafted would enable the developer to provide 75 mobile homes on the Inkster site if his request is submitted and then approved.

SOBLE ORIGINALLY submitted a SOBLE ORIGINALLY submitted a petition for mobile homes and then switched his zoning request to low-rise apartments. When it was in-dicated he would face vigorous opposi-tion from nearby residents, Soble de-cided to resubmit his mobile home plan. The proposed mobile home park district (RMH) is intended to apply only to large, vacant unplatted areas on the periphery of existing or proposed single-family subdivisions.

The ordinance as currently drawn would provide an alternate form of de-tached single-family housing provid-ing the owner the flexibility of moving his living unit from place to place. The district would provide a transi-ion from single-family subdivisions to

more intensive residential and non-residential land uses, Gross said. Among conditions are that the mo-

THE SITE PLAN must include pro-visions for ingress and egress. Den-sity is limited to a maximum of 9,000 square feet per mobile home and min-imum front, side and rear setback re-quirements of 50 feet from all proper-ty lines must be maintained and land-scaped, according to the proposed or-dinance. dinance.

Among other provisions under consideration are a minimum distance of 15 feet between mobile homes, a minimum of two parking spaces for each unit, screened refuse facilities and a bile home site be a minimum of 25 acres, and the site plan abuts a major thoroughfare, a more intensive residential zoning district, non-residential

Any site plan for a mobile home park is subject to approval of the city council upon recommendation of the planning commission.

minimum of 300 square feet of recrea-tion space per mobile home.

Mobile homes must be supported on masonry blocks or jacks, connected to utilities and constructed with durable material. Outdoor storage of junk cars, trash and other refuse would be prohibited.

The city currently has two trailer parks, Southfield Downs on Southfield and Twelve and One-Half Mile roads and Southfield Gardens on Telegraph Road between Eight and Nine mile roads. Both are non-conforming uses in residential zones.

Southfield officials considered a mo bile home park ordinance about two years ago when the Michigan Court of Appeals established a preferred zon-ing doctrine for residential districts.
