People are hankering for some good, old fashioned horseradish. Oldtimers tell us you can dig the horseradish roots in spring or fall, during a month with an "R" in it. Or you can buy roots ready for planting from your nursery or seed house.

To make horseradish, scrape or peel the root and grind fine, through a behender or food chopper. To each cup of ground root, add 'a cup vinegar, 'ts' up water and 'a cup of sugar. Put into small jars with tight fitting lid. Some people and 's cup or less of fresh milk to the mixture to keep the borseradish from turning dark.
