

Sisterhood 'adopts' man

A group of women from the Sisterhood of Temple Beth Jacob, Pontiac, is helping to keep hope alive for Yuli Tartakovsky, a self-proclaimed "refuse-nik."

The Sisterhood, whose members include residents from West Bloomfield, Troy and Southfield, has "adopted" Tartakovsky, a Russian Jew who wants to emigrate to Israel but has been denied an exit visa.

Tartakovsky and his compatriots coined the term "refuse-nik" to describe those who receive repeated refusals from the Russian government for emigration.

The plight of Tartakovsky and

others was described to the Sisterhood recently by Shirley Leopold, past chairperson of the Detroit Committee on Soviet Jewry and presently on the board of the Jewish Community Council.

She told the women, "Jews have a peculiar talent. We live on different levels, in different places, at different times...but when a Jew cries in Siberia, he is heard in Jerusalem, and he is heard in Pontiac."

Mrs. Leopold told the Sisterhood that its financial and moral support of activists such as Tartakovsky, "guarantees their survival. It's an insurance policy that you have taken out for them."

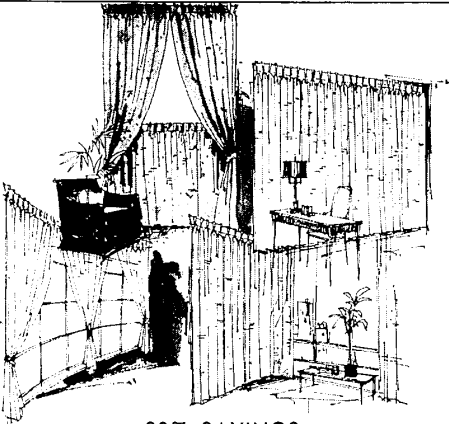

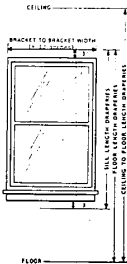
