

Ruth Dayan plans visit

Mrs. Ruth Dayan will appear at the home of Hadassah President Mrs. Jerome Kaufman on Sunday on behalf of the State of Israel Bond Sponsor Program and the 10 Days of Rededication.

Mrs. Dayan is president of Maskit, the Israeli government-operated arts and crafts company, and was the wife of former defense minister of Israel, Moshe Dayan.

Sponsors are the guardians of Israel, women who devote involvement with Israel through the purchase of Israel bonds on levels starting at \$1,000.

This special event is a forerunner of the "Woman of the Year" tribute luncheon honoring immediate past president, Phyllis Newman, on Tuesday, Oct. 22.

Mrs. Dayan has been closely associated with Maskit since its formation in 1954. Under her guidance the company has grown and become a vital part of the lives of many Israelis.

It also plays a key role in keeping alive the traditional crafts and skills of Israel and other countries which might otherwise become extinct.

As head of Maskit, Mrs. Dayan has extended the company's influence to the Arab and Druze populations in Israel, encouraging home industries in their villages.

Since the Six Day War of 1967, she has been active in the towns on the west bank and in the Gaza Strip, finding markets for Arab handicrafts and suggesting new materials and lines.

A recognized authority in the field, Mrs. Dayan has represented Israel at international conferences on arts and crafts.

SHE IS ALSO active in welfare work for Jewish and Arab children and was vice-chairman of the Israel Variety Club.

After returning to Israel, she attended high school in Jerusalem and then an agricultural school at Nahalal, Israel's first communal farming village.

In addition to speaking for Hadassah, Mrs. Dayan will appear Monday at Claire Pearene's in Somerset Mall, Troy. Where she will present arts and crafts and fashions from Maskit.

She will also autograph her book, "Crafts of Israel," which has just been released.

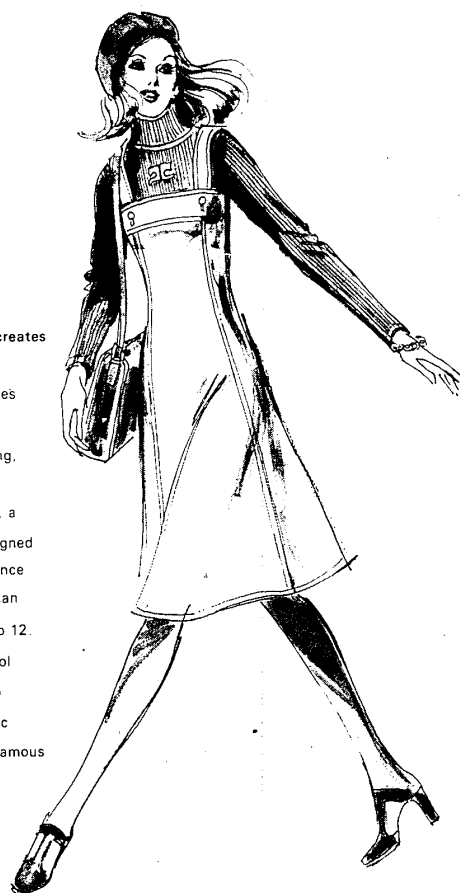
