



## Bluegrass heavyweights

The Country Store, one of the nation's finest bluegrass groups as judged by music publications, is appearing at the Raven Gallery, 29101 Greenfield, Southfield, through Oct. 6. Two shows are scheduled on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Sunday nights at 9:30 and 10:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday performances are set at 9:30 and 11:30 p.m. There is a cover charge.

Three-time brass band world champions, the National Band of New Zealand brings its sound to Masonic Auditorium Friday at 8:30 p.m.

Accompanying the band are the spirited Maori Dancers who sing and dance native Polynesian rhythms from Aotearoa, the Land of the Long White Cloud.

Under the direction of Mervyn J. Waters, the 60-man band was selected from town bands throughout New Zealand.

Earlier this year, the brass troupe played for Queen Elizabeth at the opening of the 10th British Commonwealth Games at New Zealand's South Island. Their performance was broadcast to some 50 million viewers around the world.

Unlike military bands, the true brass band consists of cornets, alto and flugal horns, baritone, euphoniums, trombones, basses and percussion; no reed or woodwind instruments are used.

In addition to brass works and

marches, the band features transcriptions of well known classics, native Maori melodies and light music.

The Maori Dancers perform ancient chants, war dances, action songs and poi dances which involve swinging flaxen balls in intricate patterns.

THE HAKA, or war dance, is an inclusive term for all forms of Maori dance, demonstrating a con-

trolled rhythmic response of voice and body in the telling of a tale.

The program features "The Challenge," a traditional act to determine whether a visiting party is friendly or hostile, the "Kua Rongorongo," a farewell and the "Illuminated Poi," a modern innovation to the poi dances.

Tickets for the performance are available at all Hudson's and Grinnell's stores and the Masonic Temple Box Office.

## Founders set series
