

# Zoning law violater is fined

FARMINGTON HILLS—A \$250 fine has been imposed on the owner of a lawn sprinkling company who was found guilty of attempting to establish a business in a residential area.

Residents of Waldron street in Farmington Hills suspected that Charles Bellmore of Bellmore Lawn Sprinkling Co. was attempting to establish a business or factory in a garage behind a house on Waldron.

They alerted the Hills zoning department, who investigated the case, and eventually issued a summons to Bellmore.

The residents of Waldron became suspicious and called the zoning department after workman began doing extensive repair work to a garage at the rear of the house, but ignored the house at the front of the property.

This is the second time residents in the area have prevented industrial use from moving into that garage. About five years ago the residents began court action when another company wanted to set up a factory in the garage.

They won that court case, and the area has been residential ever since.


