
Showcase a collection

Valuable items like coins and porcelains can be put behind locked doors for safety. Many cabinets come thusly equipped.


Remember to choose cabinetry which will harmonize with the general scheme of the room. Otherwise it will stand out like a sore thumb in the wrong room.


