Judge forbids special ballot designation

OAKLAND COUNTY—No ballot designations will be inserted in the potentially confusing Oakland County Probate court race between Barry Grant and John J. O'Brien, Circuit Court Judge Robert Webster ruled last week.

Webster overturned the decision by the county election commission, which approved a plan to have the November ballot indicate that the O'Brien in the race was not the same as better-known Circuit Court Judge John N. O'Brien.

"I couldn't find statutory authority for the election commission to proceed in the manner it did," Judge Webster said of his ruling.

Grant contended that O'Brien finished first in the primary election for probate judge largely because voters thought the circuit court judge was running. Grant convinced at least two of the three election commission members that ballot designations were needed to avoid confusion.

THE ELECTION COMMISSION decided the ballot could indicate below O'Brien's name that he was not the present circuit court judge—a decision that O'Brien protested as giving his opponent unfair advantage.

The Webster ruling held that the election commission had the authority to permit ballot designations only when two candidates in the same race have similar names.

"I'm gratified at Judge Webster's ruling," O'Brien said. "It establishes the fairness of this election."

O'Brien's opponent had accused him of fostering the name confusion through a low key campaign that made little attempt to separate candidate O'Brien from Circuit Court Judge O'Brien.

O'Brien, although he spent less than \$300 on his primary campaign, finished well ahead of two more-heavily-financed campaigns. Grant, who finished second, spent more than \$14,000 on the race.

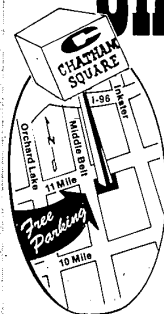

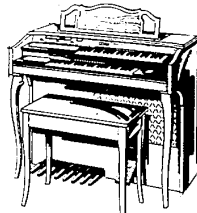
