



Eliot Janeway, former presidential adviser, will be first speaker of Southfield Series

Economist coming

SOUTHFIELD—Economist and former presidential adviser Eliot Janeway will be the first speaker in this year's Southfield Series.

Janeway was business editor of Time Magazine and personal adviser to the late Henry Luce, as well as a business trends consultant to Newsweek. He also acted as adviser to Lyndon Johnson for a number of years.

Janeway will speak during the luncheon and lecture program Oct. 17 at Southfield's Raleigh House on Telegraph Road.

Five other lectures have also been scheduled. Guest speakers run the gamut from an automotive president to a light-hearted Presidential hopeful to an expert on the Space Age.

Nov. 21, Reid Buckley, who lables himself "a Christian, Libertarian Conservative" will take a serious look at contemporary society and prognosticate its future. He is perhaps best known as the author of *The Eye of the Hurricane*.

JAN. 16, Anna Chennault, airline executive, best-selling author and journalist, will bring to the series accounts of her varied life. Two of her books, *Chennault* and *The Flying Tigers* and *A Thousand Springs* are the first complete accounts of her husband's life and the American volunteer pilots he organized into a fighting unit.

Feb. 20, space expert Gordon Gray is the scheduled speaker. Gray, special assistant for space programs, Rockwell International, will present a layman-oriented speech and slide presentation on what the Space Age is doing to mankind. He will discuss whether the space travel has been worthwhile and what the space shuttle has to offer man.

MAR. 20, Dr. James Boren, internationally known authority on dynamic inaction, is the scheduled guest speaker. Boren is founder of NATAPROBU (National Association of Professional Bureaucrats) and once ran for president as the Bureaucrat's candidate. His platform was, "Red Tape is the tape that binds the world together." Boren's motto: "When in doubt, mumble."

April 17, Roy D. Chapin Jr. will conclude the lecture series. Chapin has been chairman of American Motors Corp. since 1967. Before that, he steadily worked his way up through the ranks of the nation's fourth largest automotive company, starting in 1938 as an experimental engineer with Hudson.

THE LECTURES are given at luncheon meetings, usually on the third Thursday of the month, except when in conflict with holidays. The luncheons begin at noon.

According to the Southfield Series promoters, the programs should end by 1:45 p.m.

Tickets for the series cost \$4.75 a person. Corporations, companies or individuals may obtain a one-year membership for \$50.

The series was founded in 1968 by Henry as a project to help establish a cultural program for Southfield. Since that time, more than 14,000 persons have attended the series.

Among the past speakers are Will Rogers Jr., Robin Moore, Bob Consigned, Ara Parsaghan, Shorty Powers and U.S. Marine Corp. Deputy Commander Gen. Lew Walt.

Top man on safety to speak

The nation's top traffic safety official, Dr. James B. Gregory, will be the guest speaker Sept. 27, at the seventh annual meeting of the Traffic Improvement Association (TIA) of Oakland County.

Dr. Gregory is administrator of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration of the U. S. Department of Transportation. The federal administration operates as the focal point for the guidance and funding of local and state traffic improvement programs.

Dr. Gregory's jurisdiction includes the establishing of automobile safety standards and educating drivers in better habits.

He has been in his present capacity since August 1973, and will have a leading role in administering the federal Highway Safety Act of 1973, which expands national involvement in local traffic safety programs.

The luncheon meeting at the Raleigh House also will include reports on the year's activity from its two-year president, F. James McBohald, general manager of Chevrolet Division of General Motors; and on the two-year county programs of the American Bar Association and the International Association of Chiefs of Police.
