Jefferson, Detroit. On sale will be everything from hand-pained bowls to children's toys as well as Christmas decorations. The Holiday Mart has become an annual event for Planned Parenthood, which relies heavilly on private donations and sale proceeds for support.

Jewish college sets registration

Of special interest are courses especially designed for non-Jews preparing for conversion to Judaism.


