

## Jewish college sets registration

A total of 18 courses on a wide variety of Jewish subjects will be offered to the adults of the entire Jewish community when the College of Jewish Studies opens its fall semester.

Bernard E. Linden, chairman of the board of governors of the college, announced that the college will be housed at the new Temple Beth El, Telegraph at Fourteen Mile Road, Birmingham.

The college is sponsored by the Metropolitan Detroit Federation of Reform Synagogues and all courses are taught by the rabbis, cantors and educators of affiliated congregations.

Courses are open to any adult in the community and include beginner's and advanced Hebrew, beginner's and advanced Yiddish, Bible, the Book of Kings, modern Jewish history, Biblical philosophy, modern Jewish Philosophy, rabbinic responses to modern Jewish problems, comparative religion, the prayerbook, folk music of the Shetl and Chassidism.

Cantor Arthur Asher, dean of the college of Jewish studies, announced that fourteen weekly

Of special interest are courses especially designed for non-Jews preparing for conversion to Judaism.

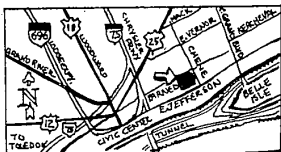

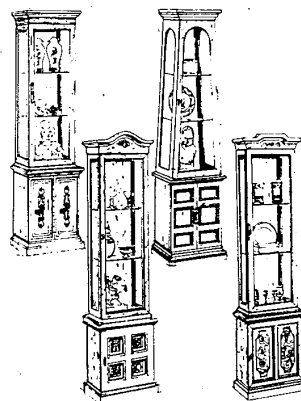

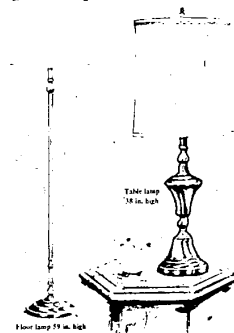
