"We really stuck them," said Laker coach Dominic Livedoti. "Our boys played a great game and they did an outstanding job." Fumbles and penalties dominated play of both teams in the first quarter.

Late in the opening stanza, a Laker penalty nullified their first score of the night, but three plays later half-back Bob Wilson ran the ball in from the one to climax the drive.

ANOTHER PENALTY nullified the conversion attempt, but Wilson again made good on the second effort with a two-point pass play to Bill Lowman.

West Bloomfield's 8-0 lead held firm until the third quarter when Ketter-ing's Kirk Gibson raced 11 yards into

the end zone to cut the margin. Laker tackle Casey Gawronski then broke through to stop the conversion and keep the visitors on top.

At 8:17 of the final quarter Rob Hinsberg boosted the Laker lead to 14-6 on a three yard run, but another untimely penalty nullified a successful conversion kick by Gawronski and the second try fell short.

The Captains made a bid to dead-lock the contest with three minutes remaining on the clock as 8ill Kurtz hit paydirt from three yards out.

HOWEVER THE Laker line again rose to the occasion as Wilson and Don Tino nailed Gibson short of the goal line to thwart the conversion at-

tempt.
West Bloomfield almost played give-away by fumbling the ball away with time running out, but a Kettering clipping penalty stalled the final drive

The new sport established its roots in crowded cities such as Boston and New York where the availability of ice is scarce, and in the south where there just isn't any ice.
