CHURCHILL WAS never in the game after the first half. In the third quarter, Pink scored on a one-yard plunge, and then threw Il yards to Valassis for another TD. Mike Bowden dashed five yards for the Hawks' final touchdown in the last quarter.

Paul Rogind kicked all five extra points. The soccer-style kicker has converted on all 21 of Harrison's touchdowns this season. He's three for four in the field goal department.
