The City of Farmington ordains:

Section 1. Adoption of Code by Reference. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 8 of the State Construction Code Act (Act 239 of 1972, Compiled Laws 1948, Section 125.150) et seq. the 1971 Edition of the National Electrical Code as published by the National Fire Protection Association, is hereby adopted by reference.

Section 2. Code on File. Complete printed copies of the 1971 National Electrical Code herein adopted, are available for public use and inspection at the office of the City Clerk.

Section 3. References to Code. References in the 1971 National Electrical Code to "State" and "name of State" shall mean the State of Michigan; references to "municipality" and "name of municipality" shall mean the City of Farmington; references to the "Municipal Charter" shall mean the Charter of the City of Farmington; and references to "local ordinances" shall mean the Farmington City Code.

Section 4. This ordinance will be effective after publication in accordance with the Charter of the City.
