

# Farmington wins on Harmon field goal

Farmington coach Hal Beardsley really couldn't be blamed if he saw Lloyd's of London about insurance for Tom Harmon's right foot.

Harmon, a 5-9 175-pound sophomore, is Farmington's place kicker, a position he's likely to hold for some time if he keeps doing what he did in the Falcon's non-league game with Southfield High last Saturday.

Harmon booted a 26-yard field goal, and Farmington's defense made those points stand up for a 3-0 victory. Harmon's heroics took place in the second quarter on a fourth-and-four situation after a drive died on the Blue Jay eight.

"We had third down and long on that drive," Beardsley said. "We knew that, regardless of where we were on fourth down, we were going for a field goal."

"And he (Harmon) kicked that thing 15 or 20 yards beyond the goal posts."  
Actually, the final score was no indicator of either team's offensive punch. A look at the statistics shows that both schools generated plenty of offense — but no touchdowns. Farmington made it to the Southfield 11 near the end of the half, but a Mark Kanny pass was incomplete in the endzone.

**SOUTHFIELD ALSO** had its chances. The Jays penetrated to

the Falcon six in the second quarter, but the drive died on downs. With seconds left in the game, Southfield again drove to the enemy eight, but Mike Jusicino's pass was intercepted by Rick Milhizer as time ran out.

"We didn't score, but we moved the ball," said Southfield coach John Finlayson. "When it counted

we couldn't do it."

Jusicino, a senior, had an excellent passing day, completing nine of 15 with one intercepted for 101 yards. His favorite target was senior end Steve Trowbridge, who made seven receptions for 94 yards.

The lack of scoring indicates

that both teams mastered the defense when needed.

"We're really pleased with our defense," Beardsley said. "We've gone up against three throwing quarterbacks (Jusicino, Stevenson's Bruce Nichols and Waterford's Bill Foster), and we've given up only two touchdowns to them."

Farmington's defense was led by lineman Mark Churella (six solo tackles and six assists), linebacker Jeff (eight solos and 16 assists), halfback Kanny (seven tackles and three deflected passes), and tackle Jim Moore (six tackles and two QB sacks).

**SOUTHFIELD** linebacker turned in his usual fine game with six solos and seven assists. Brian Toian, moved to linebacker for this game, made six tackles, helped on seven more and batted down a pass. Tackle Mark Arrowsmith came through with two key tackles.

Farmington fullback John Hans led all rushers with 93 yards in 13 carries. Southfield's Rick Wieland

Southfield, now 2-6 overall, ends its season at home next Friday against city-rival Southfield-Lath-

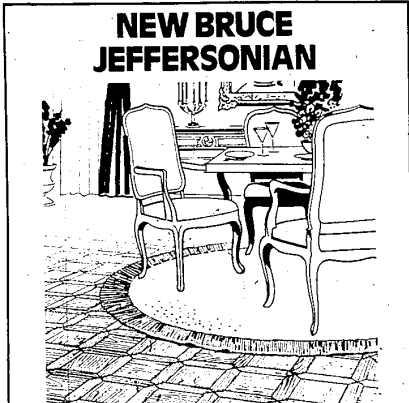
rup. Finlayson rates the game a tossup, even though Lathrup is missing five starters benched by injuries.

## Oakland drops 1st

The Oakland University soccer team, hoping for a N.C.A.A. Division II berth, has two games remaining on the schedule. The Pioneers play host to Spring Arbor College on Saturday (Nov. 9), followed by a visit from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee on Nov. 16. Both games start at 1 p.m.

The Pioneer booters absorbed their first defeat of the season, losing to Wabash College 2-1. Wabash scored two early goals, first on a penalty kick by Alex Betz and then on a goal by his brother Bob at the 25-minute mark of the first half.

The second half was all Oakland's, as the Pioneers fired 14 shots on goal. Andris Richters closed the gap to 2-1 on a penalty kick at the 17-minute mark of the second half. Two other shots bounded off the goal post and another hit the crossbar and appeared to drop over the line before the Wabash goalie cleared the ball.

**OAKLAND'S ONE-TWO** scoring punch, Ken and Barry Whiteside, fired 12 shots in the second half but couldn't beat the Wabash goalkeeper.

Oakland's center fullback Andris Richters played another outstanding game.

"He is, by far, the best fullback we've seen this season. Many times he has turned an opponent's scoring threat into an Oakland advantage with his long clearing passes," according to coach Motzer.

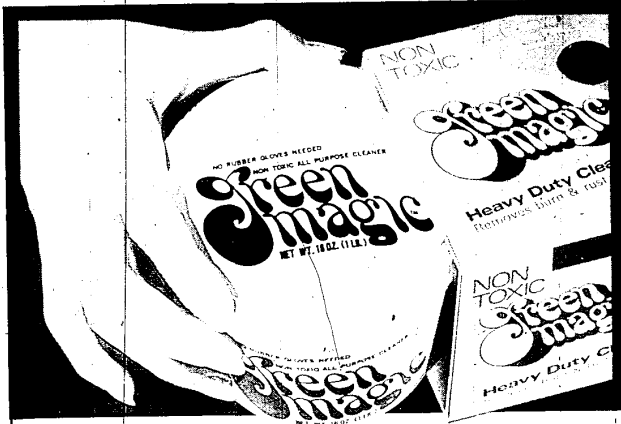
Andy also has four goals to his credit this year on three penalty shots and a free kick.

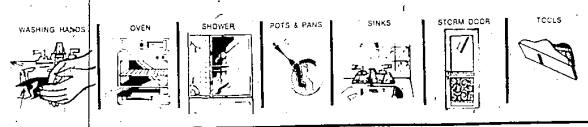
