

Musical sorority holds dinner, concert

Mu Phi Epsilon, international professional music sorority, will celebrate its Annual Founders' Day with a dinner and concert beginning at 6:30 p.m. Monday, Nov. 18, at North Congregational Church, 26274 Northwestern Highway, Southfield.

"We hope to get about 200 people at the dinner," said Nancy McDonough, chairman, a 24-year member of the sorority.

She said the concert following dinner at 8:15 p.m. is free and open to the public.

On the concert program is Patricia Wasama, organist, of Southfield, a former recipient of the group's scholarship program.

Also featured will be Wilha Hutson, well known for her lyrics in the Burt Carols.

MS. HUTSON will premiere two numbers of her own composition which will be performed by the North Church Choir under the direction of Wayne State University professor of vocal music, Harry Langford.

Other works by Thompson, Brahms and other composers will be included.

Duo pianists Margaret Paulian and Viola Peponis also will be on

the program with the North Church Quartet performing Brahms, Liebeslieder Waltz's, opus 52.

"We would love to see a capacity audience of 450 to 500 at the concert," Mrs. McDonough said.

She said one of the historic traditions of Founders Day program is the contribution of a penny for each year of the sorority's life.

"THIS YEAR that means 71 cents," she said.

"It adds up to a great deal of money when it comes from thousands of members all over the country."

The funds support the sorority's philanthropic ventures which include scholarships, support for the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, the Women's Symphony and the Music Settlement School locally.

"Nationally, they maintain Gads Hill Community Music Center for underprivileged children in Chicago, assist in the publication of 'The Braille Musician' and provide music therapy scholarships and other aid," she said.
