Democrat Dorthea Becker's effort to "bring the two-party system to the 65th district" succuribed to the dual pressure of a stauent Republican electorate and a well-liked incumbent as James E. Defebaugh was returned to the State House for his third term. Defebaugh, 48, emerged with an unofficial total of 8,340 votes, as compared to Mrs. Becker's 24,77. In his two terms in the House, Defebaugh gained influence with other legislators, resulting in the success of a number of important bills and also his election as House Republican whip.
