# Andover clobbers Knights

"THEY WERE so much bigger than us, and we really hit them," he said.

The Barons posted a 13-3 halftime lead with both teams blocking and tackling like there was no tomorrow. "Both teams were well prepared." said Ted Guhard, Lahser coach. "They made fewer mistakes and they deserved to win the sword, and everything that goes with, it."

Andover scored first in the opening period as Baron captain Bob Hofloway plunged into the end zone from two yards out, with Terry Henderson booting the extra point.

THE KNIGHTS closed the gap to 7-3 on a 42-yard field goal by Chuck Herbst, but a Labser fumble with less than four minutes in the half proved costly. Moments later, Andover quartertack Jim Breaugh (tipped a screen pass to Jerry Meter who rambled 32 yards for the score.

"They ran that screen play well," Guthard said. "We practiced against it all week, and they still ran it well."


With fourth down and time expiring. North looked for the last time in his prep career for Mazade, but the pass was overthrown.
