paneling can change the entire appearance of a room.


In the room at left, for example, the decorating goal was to achieve the most dramatic change lat the least possible cost.

A single wall, in this case two sheets of 4 by 8 prefinished hardboard paneling, was decided upon. The paneling is Masonite Briancliff, a rich simulation of oak panel inserts highlighted by detailed panel strips.

Plant of the week

There are many species of caladium. Caladium bicolor is a native of Trinidad. Brazil and Guiana. Its firm leaves, shaped like an arrowhead, are green with red veins and scattered white spots.

Caladiums grow profusely during the spring and summer and are domant during the winter. Some varieties have red, pink or variegated leaves.

Michigan State University horticulturists suggest:

SOIL should be rich in humus, peat moss, sphagnum moss or shredded fir bark. If drainage is a problem add broken brick, charcoal, granite chips, perlite or coarse sand to the soil mix-ture.

WATER-Keep the soil evenly moist but not constantly wet. Allow it to become slightly dry between water-ings. During the winter, when it is not actively growing, it may need less

TEMPERATURES should range from 60 to 65 degrees F at night and 80 degrees F during the day. The caladium will withstand low temperatures found in most homes this winter with thermostats turned down. During the summer, place the plants outdoors for a period of time to get fresh air.

LIGHT—Indirect or diffused sun-light will provide the light needed for healthy growth. Keep out of direct sun-light, preferably near an east window.

PROPAGATION is by division of tubers in the spring.

How to make your own sauerkraut

Many gardeners raised their own cabbage, but not many are aware they can make a chocolate sauerkraut cake that's out of this world.

Early and late cabbage can be used, as can the red or green types. Bemove the outer leaves, and the core tuse the frated core for soups, stews or salads). Street the solid heads into thin sites: Pack it promptly in a clean jar or ctock, using alterpate layers of cabbage and salt.

Use one pound of salt to 40 pounds of cabbage of vis lib of salt for 20 pounds of cabbage, lyou can make layers about by inch think with sprinklings of salt over each one. If any salt remains, sprinkle lift on the top, Try to portion out the cabbage so you do not un out of salt for the top layers. In any case, do not add lextra salt as the brine will be too salty.

THE CABBAGE should be covered with a clean, round board that just fits inside the crock It's a good idea to put a piece of cheescoloth over the cabbage before adding the board to keep pieces of cabbage from floating up with the brine. Weight the board down with a clean, washed rock. Do

not use a pitch pine board as it will cause off flavor.
After fermentation is complete, skim off any scum that forms, if the kratu is to be kept in a cool place, probably no seal is needed. If in a warm place, the kratu can be sealed by pouring melted paraffin over the top. GREEN THUMB CLINIC:
