A Farmington student at Michigan State University has been selected for membership in Delta Phi Alpha, a national honorary German fraternity.

Karen Pierce, 30624 Charleston Court, was asked to join the organization which promotes German studies after she had a year of schooling at the University of Freiburg in Germany.

She is a senior education major, specializing in German, plans to do her student teaching requirement this winter in Wall Lake.

Speaking of her year in Germany, Miss Pierce said she could only describe Freiburg as a "beautiful, picturesque town."

"WITH THE Black Forest surrounding two sides of the town, walking and exercise are the main activities there," she said. "The paths are well marked and even older people will take regular walks through the woods."

During school breaks, Miss Pierce traveled to Switzerland and Belgium. She also took a hiking trip through the Pyrenees. Her most memorable trip, was to Morocco.

"We took a Volkswagen bus, so we were able to stay away from the cities and get the actual feel of the country," she said. "The people were incredible, extremely generous and friendly. They had very little, but would give us things like oranges or even invite us in for peppermint tea. This trip had to be the highlight of all the ones I took."
