WHILE SIMILAR units have WHILE SIMILAR units have been built for less money, the Wabek Woods condos guarantee virtually a northwoods setting from any window.

An unbuildable strip from the opposite shore of Wabeek Lake up to nearly the crest of a hill means even when completed, the picture-postcard setting will remain.

Only a few homes will ultimately be visible along the opposite shore, and Woods residents will have the confort of knowing these will be rising from lots priced at \$50,000 and up.

The units will be built in four, three and two-unit clusters, Multiple level heating problems are solved with zoned heating, with two furnaces when necessary.

The Woods is being developed by Vilican and Fred Korzon, who also said he intends to move in on completion.


