The 10-member dance troupe, part of Young Audiences Inc., came to the school as part of a pilot program to introduce the arts to the students.

But this was art that was fashioned for fun, for learning and for participation.

The troupe danced into the school Wednesday, Nov. 20, for a one-hour assembly.

During the hour the dancers clowned and pantomimed and did bal-

let. And while they danced, director Lisa Nowak explained what was going on.

"I THINK you're going to find that everybody dances," she told the audience packed into the bleachers of the school's gymnasium.

She said the group had danced outside the auditorium where they have performed, and they once danced on the steps of a police station in Kansas.

The group went through a series of dance stages, beginning with walking movements and working up through marching and into locomotive movements.

Near the end of the hour the emphasis switched to the audience.

"Now the dancers are going to help you," Lisa said. "They are going to help you dance-sitting down."

Grins, moans and cries of "Oh no" poured out of the audience as members of the troupe climbed into the bleachers.

"NOW PAY attention because you're going to learn a dance that you can do sitting down. You can do it in math class," she said.

Again moans and groans and more laughter.

Lisa then had everyone wiggle his toes then scratch his right eye then shake his head and then stand up and sit down. Once everyone had that down pat, Lisa switched things around and added variations.

"Stand up slow and then sit down fast. Stick out your tongue twice." And that's the way it went. But it was madness with a method.

According to the organizers of Youth Audiences, the purpose of the national performing troupes is to get students to become active participants in an educational event.

PAUL FRAN, eastern regional program director, said the organization has 40 chapters nationally and has already presented more than 10,000 programs nationally.
