

# Prime Minister's Club to hear Israeli leader

Moshe Kol, minister of tourism of the State of Israel, will be the guest speaker on Monday, Jan. 20, at a dinner of the Prime Minister's Club for greater metropolitan Detroit.

The dinner will be held at the Birmingham home of David Holtzman, president of the club, which is an exclusive group of supporters of Israel Bonds.

Kol will address those who have joined or renewed their membership in the group.

BORN IN Russia in 1911, Kol went to Israel in 1932 and made his home on a farm settlement.

As a member of the Council of

Provisional Government during Israel's War of Independence, he was one of the signers of Israel's Declaration of Independence.

Kol has served in Israel's Knesset and was one of the founders of the General Zionist Workers Movement. He was the movement's first delegate to the Histadrut.

During World War II, he became a member of the secretariat of the Histadrut executive, and established the central Labor exchange office which he served as chairman.

In the 1940s, he was named chairman of the Management Board of Youth Aliyah and worked to rescue tens of thousands of refugee children who were brought to Israel.

He was elected to the Jewish Agency executive and from 1948 on, headed the Youth Aliyah program for 18 years.

Kol has written several books

and has had many articles published on educational, political and labor subjects.

He is one of the founders of the Yad Vashem Memorial to the six million Jews who died during WW II, and has been active in many organizations that benefit children.

In 1966, Kol was appointed to the Israel cabinet as minister of tourism and has been responsible for expanding tourist facilities throughout Israel.

Because of the economic needs in the wake of the Yom Kippur War, a \$1,000,000,000 reconstruction and development issue has been floated by the State of Israel, the largest in the history of the Israel Bond Organization.

Proceeds from the sale of Israel bonds will make possible the rehabilitation of the war-dislocated economy and the establishment of

job opportunities for immigrants from Soviet Russia and other countries.

Israel bonds also help finance agricultural projects, the construction of highways and public housing and the exploitation of natural resources.
