## Southfield 5th in Ypsi tournament

Southfield High compiled 180 points and finished fifth in the sixteen-field at the first annual Ypsilanti holiday swimming tournament Dec. 28.

Jackson High won the team title, scoring 240 points. Ypsilanti High scored 205, Plymouth Salem 180, Adrian High 150, and Hazel Park 110.

"Jackson did it on depth," said Southfield coach Bob Harding. "They had nice depth all the way down the line. It seemed like most of their kids were there, even though it was in the middle of Christmas vacation."

Southfield's 400-yard freestyle relay team (Ken Erickson, Steve Kushner, Stuart Schechter and Ed Wilkie) took first place in 3:35.4.

The Blue Jays' 200-yard medley relay (Schechter, Bill Beard, Kushner and Erickson) finished second in 1:53.4. Adrian won the event with a 1:52.4.

"It was a good race," Harding said. "We were tied with them (Adrian) going off the third leg, but they have a sprinter who goes 22.8. That's tough to beat."

Southfield also picked up some points in the 100-yard freestyle where Wilkie finished second in .53.8. Schechter took a third in the 200-yard individual medley (2:21.2), and Erickson finished third in the 50-yard freestyle (.24.2).

"My swimmers did some complaining the light at the deep end of the pool," Harding said.

"The light in the water can really affect a swimmer's turns. If you're too far away, you're missing the wall. You're not getting a good push off. If

you're too close, you're tucked up in a ball on the wall." Southfield, which is 2-1 in dual meets, swims next at home against Madison Heights Lamphere on Jan. 7. The meet begins at 7:30 p.m.
