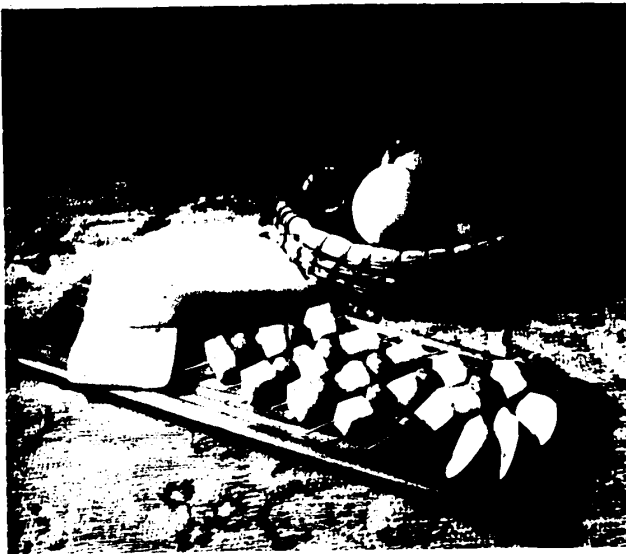

Instead of meat and vegetables, try cheese and fruit on a skewer

Cheese appetizers mean quick, easy entertaining

Appetizers that are quick or easy to prepare in advance can be a real boon to any entertaining.

Two such dishes are cheese kabobs and coconut cheese balls.

Presented as a new hors d'oeuvre idea from Country Line Cheese Company, cheese kabobs are a combination of cheese and shish kabobs. But instead of meat and vegetables, the traditional shish kabob, alternate cheese and fruit for a new taste idea.

CHEESE KABOBS can be easily assembled when the ingredients and supplies are arranged in assembly line order — picks or skewers, pieces of fruit and chunks of cheese.

For a different flavor, marinate canned, fresh or frozen fruit in a sweet-sour sauce before threading. Cheddar, Colby and Swiss cheeses combine well with the fruit. Melon and cheddar cheese or nectarines with Swiss cheese are two possibilities.

If fresh fruits aren't available, canned mandarin oranges or sweet cherries provide an Oriental twist. Bananas or apples should be dipped in lemon juice to prevent darkening.

In addition to pleasing the palate, fruit and natural cheese provide two of the four basic food groups needed every day in the diet.

COCONUT BALLS are an appetizer you can make days or hours ahead of time and store in the refrigerator. The combination of cream cheese and Roquefort cheese is rolled in flaked coconut, chopped pecans and parsley.

Coconut-Cheese Party Ball
1 package (8 oz.) softened cream cheese
1/2 pound (8 oz.) Roquefort cheese, crumbled
2/3 cup flaked coconut
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
1 teaspoon finely grated onion
1/2 cup chopped pecans
1/2 cup finely chopped parsley

Combine cream cheese and Roquefort cheese in a small bowl. Blend well. Add 1/2 cup of the coconut, the Worcestershire sauce and onion. Cover with wax paper or plastic wrap. Chill at least six hours.

Combine remaining 1/2 cup coconut, the pecans and parsley on a piece of aluminum foil or wax paper. Form cheese mixture into a ball, roll in coconut mixture to cover completely.

Place on a platter, garnish with watercress, if desired, and serve with crackers. Makes about 2 1/2 cups.

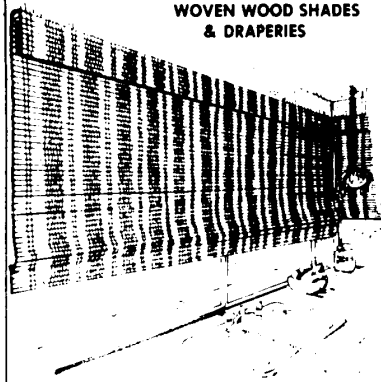
Sorority schedules January meeting

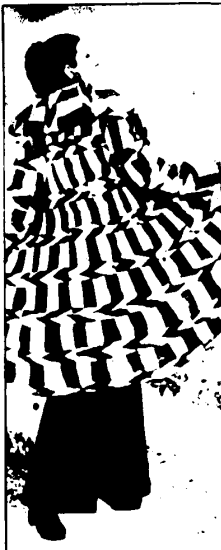

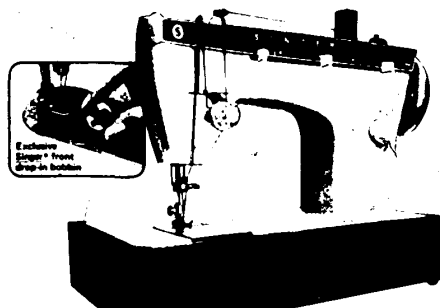
