Hypoallergenic cosmetics discussed in fact-sheet

Exchanging information with a friend is one way to find out what might be good for your super-sensitive skin. Another way that might help you figure out what hypoallergenic cosmetics are all about is to write for a reprint from the Food and Drug Administration Single copies of "Hypoallergenic Cosmetics" are free from Consumer Information, Pueblo Co. 81009.

SOME CONSUMERS think hypoallergenic means "nonallergenic" when it actually only means the products should be less likely to cause an adverse reaction. According to the fact sheet, there is no known way to produce a cosmetic that would be non-allergenic to everyone.

Also discussed are the various

terms you'll find when you shop. In addition to hypoallergenic, there's "suitable for sensitive skin," "less irritating," and "another might be labeled allergy tested." Industry procedures for testing these cosmetics vary. The different tests used are described in the fact sheet.

Hypoallergenic Cosmetics is one of almost 250 Federal publications of interest to consumers listed in the Winter edition of the Consumer Information Index. The Index published quarterly by the Consumer Information Center of the General Services Administration is available free from Consumer Information, Pueblo Co. 81009, and from Federal Information Centers located throughout the country.
