

# Kidnapping suspect arrested by police

SOUTHFIELD— A Detroit youth is being held on 10 courts of armed rob-bery and kidnaping involving five per-sons in two separate incidents at Northland Shopping Center.

Daryl Lavere Bryant, 17, was ar-raigned Jan. 2 before Southfield 49th District Court Judge S. James Clark-son who set bond at \$1 million. Bryant is in Oakland Courty Jail pending a Jan. 14 examination before 48th Dis-trict Court Judge Norman Feder.

Each of the charges carries a possible life sertence. Bryant was out on 800 bond for an earlier charge of unammed robbery when the Northland incidents occurred. He was apprehended after investigation by Southfield policy officers James Kerr and Donald Szafraraki.


