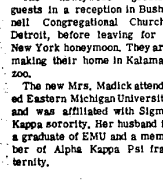
Barbara O'Dell was maid of honor, and the bridesmaids were Mary Ellen Shabek, Carol Harsch and Mrs. George Parker.
