Rosedale Gardens Teens Host In Turn About Visit

Turn-about is both fair play and the basis of wider understanding, senior high teens at Rosedale Gardens Presbyterian Church know.

Youth from the Livonia church spent last week playing host to a contingent of teens from West Virginia, showing them the interesting spots in the metropolitan area and just getting better acquainted.

It was a return visit, for last summer about 30 kids from Rosedale Gardens traveled to Arboretum, W. Va., where they helped their local counterparts paint a community center and buildings at a 4-H camp.

LAST WEEK'S visitors came from three Methodist parishes in the area North of White Sulphur Springs, leading the group of ten were the Rev. Travis Wells, pastor of the Arboretum, Greenbank and Dunmore churches, who preached in Rosedale Gardens July 21, and Mrs. Linda Cassell, mother of one of the teens.

The teens stayed in homes of Rosedale Gardens families, and during the six-day visit joined about 30 members of the local youth group in grand tours that included everything from a doubleheader at Tiger Stadium to a luau with some Hawaiians

also stopping over in the area.

"THE BEST PART for everyone," the Rev. William Lovick summed it up, "was the exposure to people whose way of life is quite different."

"We didn't specifically set discussion groups, but found that all sorts of dialogues and camping notes developed simultaneously as the kids rode the buses or picnicked."

Rev. Lovick said the West Virginia visitors tended to be quieter than the local kids and were amazed at the distances in this area.

They had plenty of chances to find out about those distances.

THEIR STOPS in downtown Detroit also included a tour of WWJ-TV, visits to Windsor, the Civic Center, the Top of the Flame restaurant, Belle Isle and the Art Institute, and a bus ride through the scenes of last summer's rioting.

The group also went to the Ford Motor Co. Rouge plant, Greenfield Village, Presbyterian headquarters in Detroit, the Shrine of the Little Flower, Kirk of the Hills, Cranbrook, Kensington Park, the Detroit Zoo, the Metropolitan Airport and Northland for shopping.

There were evening meals at the church and in the homes of the V. Pattersons and Livonia Mayor and Mrs. Harvey Moeke, and the teens in the P. Abrams home.

About 40 members of the Rosedale Gardens senior high youth group participated in the various outings.

The visit was part of a program launched by Rev. Lovick when he began his ministry here in 1965.

The summer of that year he took a group of the senior high teens to a Montana town where they worked on repairs for a mission church.

"WE CAMPED in churches along the way," he said, "and on the way out met a group of young people whose church is in Minot, N.D."

"We invited them to come to Michigan, and they did so the following summer, in 1966."

That year the Minot and Rosedale Gardens young people joined forces to work in Lutheran

and Catholic parishes in the Van Dyke and Edsel Ford areas.

Last summer the Rosedale Gardens kids went traveling again, going first to West Virginia and coming home by way of Washington, Philadelphia, New York and Montreal.

"ONE YEAR we take a big trip and the next year we stay home for our summer project," Rev. Lovick said. The decision hasn't been made yet as to where the youth group will go next summer.

The trips cost about \$2,000, he said, with expenses kept at a minimum by camping in church basements and cooking meals out.

"Whenever we find an acceptable lake, everyone jumps in for a bath," he added.

Each of the 30 or so high schoolers pays \$25 for the trip, and the rest of the money is raised through car washes, bake and candy sales and other ventures.

Dick Harden and Pat Conway have served as sponsors for trips and other activities of the senior high group.

If the kids and Rev. Lovick have anything to say about it, turn-about trips will be part of the Rosedale Gardens program for a long time.

Recent Merger Brings Westland New Church

The Warrenwoods Wesleyan Church, breaking ground in Westland Sunday, Aug. 4, represents a recently completed merger of the Wesleyan Methodist and Pilgrim Holiness churches.

The new church, combining the congregations of two churches formerly located in Detroit, will be built at 6615 Venoy Road, between Ford and Warren.

Ground-breaking is set for 4:30 p.m.

PASTORS G.I. MacDonald, minister of administration, and D. V. Bartley, minister of Christian education, said the first unit of the new church will be completed about the first of 1969 at a cost of \$170,000.

It will be chapel and education building. Later the church plans to build its main sanctuary to be used by the first of 1969 at a cost of \$170,000.

Emphasis on youth interests will be an important part of the Warrenwoods program.

The church will have a Christian Youth Crusaders program for children of school age, and a definite focus on teen activities is planned. A third minister

will join the staff to serve as Minister of Youth about the time the first unit is completed.

In addition, the church plans a day care center to accommodate 15 pre-schoolers, with enrollment beginning about Jan. 1.

THE MERGER of the Wesleyan Methodist and Pilgrim Holiness into the Wesleyan Church was completed by 5,000 delegates to a conference late in June on the campus of Anderson College at Anderson, Ind.

The delegates, equally divided between both denominations, represented clergymen and laymen of 35 nations. The two denominations have been studying union for a number of years. Formation of the Wesleyan Church was authorized when both denominations at their general conferences voted to adopt a basis for merger and a constitution in June, 1968.

The world-wide headquarters for both former denominations are located in the State of Indiana. The sister headquarters of the new Wesleyan Church has not been selected.
