Opposition To Special Tax Voiced

Members of the Oakland County Homeowners and Tax-payers Association are being urged to vote against the one-mill road tax levy at next Tues-day's election, a director of the organization has announced.

Charles Buck, who made the announcement, criticized cam-paign literature issued by a group called Citizens for Ade-quate Roads, which advocates adoption of the millage.

"We can't understand why the county has money for luxuries like a \$6.5 million jall and a \$30 million building program, but none for necessities," said Buck.

"We can't understand why they won't allow us to vote on spending money for airports, but come to us for more money for necessities the people must

have.

"The government first takes what it wants of our tax dollar what it wants of our tax dollar for its building programs, which leaves the people shorted on what they need. The people are then forced to vote more taxes in order to have minimum necessities like roads.

"Economizing should be done by the person who spends the money as well as by the guy who supplies it."
