

Glen Oaks to host 2 missionaries

The Glen Oaks Alliance Church, 5700 Rochester Road, Troy, will hold its annual missionary convention Sunday through Feb. 2. The theme for the convention will be "Forward with Christ in the Power of His Word."

The featured speakers will be two missionaries, Dawn Deets who came from Pel Plidu, Vietnam,

where she has spent a number of years in a leprosyarium.

Her close work with the Radey tribespeople as well as her firsthand observation of the trauma of war will provide background for her talks.

Coming from Ecuador will be the Rev. James McFarland, chalk

artist, ventriloquist, musician and preacher.

HE HAS WORKED in the Loja province and has assisted pastors in 18 evangelistic campaigns during the past 18 months.

All regular services on Sunday and Feb. 2 will be devoted to the

convention. In addition, there will be general meetings at 7:30 p.m. Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

The other weekdays will feature special highlights of the convention. At 6:30 p.m. Tuesday there will be a women's missionary banquet with Miss Deets.

The men's counterpart to this will be a banquet at 6:30 p.m. Thursday with Mr. McFarland. A youth night will be held at 7:30 p.m. Saturday with Mr. McFarland speaking on the subject, "Go, Man, Go."

Students sharing textbooks

Students attending the Northfield Junior Academy in Troy are sharing textbooks with students in other Seventh-day Adventist ele-

mentary schools overseas.

Alvin Astrup, principal of the Troy school, has announced that for every Bible textbook the students receive, they are setting aside a cash gift to provide a similar textbook in the language of an Adventist student in some other area where the Bible texts are not yet available.

So far \$100 has been collected. Initial demands are for the books in Spanish, East Indian, Italian and Afrikaans. Portuguese, French and German textbooks also are planned by the denomination's department of education.

THE DEPARTMENT reports that \$12,000 has been pledged for books in Spanish and another

\$12,000 for books for schools in India. A goal of \$5 per student in the church's schools across North America has been set.

There are more than 58,000 students in Adventist schools in the United States and Canada. Outside of North America the enrollment is more than 256,000 students.

The new Bible textbooks are designed as workbooks which include tear-out pages carrying assignments for the student to fill in and turn in to the teacher.

The books are illustrated in color. The denomination spent eight years preparing the books which currently serve grades one through 11.

Oakway slates third concert

Oakway Symphony Orchestra will present the third of its four subscription concerts Sunday at 4 p.m. The concert will be held at Seaholm High School. Fourteen Mile and Evergreen roads in Birmingham.

Ani Kavafian, violinist from Michigan will be guest artist. She will perform the Mozart "Concerto in D Major" and the Introduction and Rondo "Capriccioso" by Saint-Saens.

Miss Kavafian was born in Istanbul, Turkey of Armenian par-

entage. Her family moved to the Detroit area when she was quite young.

Her early studies were with Ara Zeronian and Mischa Mischakoff. Later she studied with Ivan Galamian at Juilliard School of Music where she received her Master's Degree.

In the spring of 1973, Miss Kavafian was selected for membership in Young Concert Artists as a winner of the International Auditions.

During the 1974-75 season, she is appearing in Young Concert Artist Series in colleges and universities through the West and Midwest, where she will also be on "mini-residencies."

Miss Kavafian has appeared as soloist with the Detroit Symphony, the National Symphony in Washington D. C., the Boston "Pops," the Dallas Symphony, the Greenwich Philharmonia, and the Hudson Valley Philharmonic. She has also performed at Philharmonic Hall and Lincoln Center.

Active in chamber music, she was invited to The Festival of Two Worlds in Spoleto, Italy for the past two summers.

She has been a frequent guest with the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center and has recorded chamber music for Columbia Records.

This concert brings with it a reunion. Miss Kavafian's mother is the concertmaster of the Oakway Symphony Orchestra and her former teacher is principal violinist.
