Adult ed program to open in C'ville

Adult education classes in the Clarenceville School District will start

the week of Feb. 3 and run for up to 10 weeks.

Classes will be held in the Clarenceville High School, 20155 Middle Belt, north of Seven Mile.

Among classes offered is "English as a second language," free to foreign born, and "completing high school," both meeting for 15 weeks.

"Do Something Different" will be offered for two hours a week for a \$24 fee. Students will have a choice to pick six of eight topics.

The eight are: astronomy, handwriting analysis, adventure in awareness, houseplants, law for the layman, "what happens to Mr. and Mrs. becomes Ms.," unidentified flying objects, and transactional analysis.

Interested persons may register by mail using the form provided or in person on Tuesday, Jan. 28, from 7:30-9 p.m. at the high school, or daily from 9-11 a.m. or 1-4 p.m. at the school board offices, 28830 Eight Mile near Middle Belt.

Fees are payable at registration. Refunds will be granted if classes are canceled.

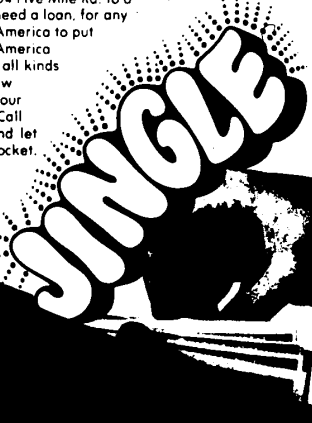
