FARMINGTON—Employers and their representatives will be gathering at Harrison High School 7-8:30 p.m. Wednesday, Feb. 5, to talk about business and management careers and employe traits.

Both students and parents can choose three of the 16 discussions which include accounting, transport management, banking, communications, data processing, hotel and

restaurant management and insurance. Also included are executive training, personnel, marketing and merchandising and office occupations. "We want these career nights to have a two-fold purpose," said Ann Areeda, counselor at Harrison, and one of the career night coordinators. "We would like the students to investigate career choices early and make tentative choices. But we also

want them to understand the characteristics and traits necessary to be good at the job."

OCC offers high school courses

FARMINGTON—Area high school seniors with good academic records can get a head start on their college programs by taking a credit course at the Orchard Ridge Campus of Oakland Community College during the winter semester.

Interested seniors must first secure a high school guest application from Orchard Ridge or their high school counseling office. A fee will be charged.
