TROY-Regionalism as a solution to the mounting problems of metropol-ian areas in Michigan received a solid boost from one of Detroit's commercial leaders last week.
Joseph L. Hudson Jr., chairman of the board of the J. L. Hudson Co., told delegates to the third aroust Conference of Michigan Foundations that a regional approach to civic decay is "essential to the revitalization of our cities."

"THE REVITALIZATION of our cities (locally and regionally) is an important control of pricely charitable) foundations on the pricely charitable foundations out contribute their attention and significant portions of their resources, "Hudson said. Hudson, and officer in Detroit Renaissance, criticized solutions to the problems of large cities which rely solely upon the "overpowering, impersonal force of big government" and which exclude the efforts of local communities and their citizens.

"We no longer can afford the waste-ful duplication of effort and facilities, the lack of efficient distribution in the system of tax revenues, the imperfect coordination of many other services in our area," he said.

"THE CONCEPT OF regionalism addresses itself to what is and what should be. A more regional approach to certain opportunities and problems can mean dollar savings to the citizen." be added.

Hudson explained that a regional approach to metropolitan problem-solving would not mean the creation of "an unneeded bureaucracy." It would result, be said, in "more careful consideration and confination" of testigera needs "which are so often scaled at the regional level."

Regionalism, Hudson added, must not be a substitute for local govern-ment and society. In fact, a regional approach "would move much of the government closer to the people."

HUDSON SAID that much of the so-cial, economic and political affairs of the Detroit area are already con-ducted on a regional basis. "What is needed," he added, "is a regional ethic to match the regional
