## Fishing guidelines established

# State moves to halt hatched trout massacre

The state has acted to prevent "slaughtering" of hatchery-reared trout on the Huron River below Proud Lake.

Trout stocked there have been easy to catch, and some fishermen, unfortu-

nately, have made pigs of themselves by catching their fish in a single day.

At the urging of local fishermen, the Natural Resources Commission has imposed these regulations on trout fishing on the Huron River from Moss Lake to the Millford Millpond, a stretch of three miles on either side of

Wixom Road in the Proud Lake State Recreation Area.

April 1-May 31—Artificial flies only, catch and release, no fish may be kept.

June 1-30—Artificial flies and lures, two 10-inch or larger trout per day.

Normal statewide regulations would

apply after the first of July.

The new rules will mean a drastic reduction in the number of fish that may be taken before July 1, and it will be tougher for fishermen to catch 'em on flies.

But a small, relatively clear stream like the Huron doesn't give fish as much maneuvering room as a large lake does. Without these rules, purist anglers as they seem to us common worm anglers, the trout will get slaughtered. It seems to be the price we'll have to pay.

**TROUT AREN'T** the sole property of the northern reaches of the state. A number of southeastern Michigan streams have been stocked with the king of the sport fish, and the DNR has designated these as official trout streams.

**OAKLAND COUNTY** Kearsley Creek from Lake Louise to the county line; Duck Creek, the entire tributary to Kearsley Creek; Highbanks Creek, entire tributary to Kearsley Creek; Paint Creek from Lake Orion dam to Rochester; Trout Creek from the dam in the Bald Mountain State Recreation Area to Paint Creek; Gallager Creek, entire tributary to Paint Creek; and the Huron River from Moss Lake to the Millford Millpond.

**MACOMB COUNTY** East Pond

Creek from East Millpond (Eldred Road) downstream; and the North Branch of the Clinton River upstream from 27 Mile Road.

Union Lake is starting to produce some large crappies; pike fishing is hot and must there, ice is safe around Union's perimeter.
