# Southfield woman is abducted from Tel-Twelve shopping Mall

**SOUTHFIELD**—A 17-year-old Plymouth man was arraigned Feb. 3 in connection with the abduction of a Southfield woman from the Tel-Twelve Mall.

John Arthur Haag, who police said is an escapee from Northville State Hospital, was arraigned in Southfield District Court on charges of kidnaping and armed robbery. Bond, set at \$25,000, was not posted and Haag was remanded to Oakland County Jail. He faces examination Feb. 10 in Southfield District Court.

Haag is charged with abducting Mary Bailey, 20, from the shopping center parking lot about 5:30 p.m., Feb. 1, Southfield police said.

According to police, Haag confronted Miss Bailey as she was about to enter her car. Police said Haag, who was armed with a handgun, forced Miss Bailey into her car. He then climbed into the back seat and ordered her to drive north on Telegraph Road to Pontiac.

In Pontiac, police said, Haag ordered the woman to drive back down Telegraph Road into Southfield and onto the freeway.

**IN TAYLOR** Miss Bailey was able to leave the car while it was stopped at a gas station. She told the station attendant she was being abducted and asked him to call the police.

After Haag and Miss Bailey left the station, police said, the attendant noted the car's license number and called the Taylor police. Taylor's police department contacted Southfield and Southfield police, in turn, contacted Miss Bailey's family to verify that she was missing.

Southfield police then put out an area-wide teletype message asking other police departments to be looking for the missing car.

In the meantime, Haag had ordered Miss Bailey to drive west on I-94 West of Jackson, in an unpopulated area. Haag ordered her out of the car and continued alone. She flagged down a motorist and a Jackson County Sheriff's car and told them what had happened, police said.

In Springport, a small town northwest of Jackson, two local police officers spotted the car and gave chase. Haag attempted to flee and the car he was driving went out of control and left the roadway, police said.

**HE WAS ARRESTED** at 9:40 p.m. Feb. 1 and returned to Southfield early the next morning.

Miss Bailey, following her four-hour ordeal, was unharmed, police said. She was robbed of \$4.

The alleged abduction represents the sixth in a string of similar incidents in Southfield within the last month and one half.

The first to be abducted was young Yale Yee, 3, who disappeared from the Tel-Twelve Mall while Christmas shopping with his father. Yale was found unharmed on a road south of Detroit.

Later abductions included a woman and her two daughters from Northland Shopping Center, a young man and his girl friend from Northland; an elder woman from an area just north of Northland; an attempted abduction at Tel-Twelve; and Miss Bailey.

**SOUTHFIELD POLICE** said arrests were made in five of the six incidents. No arrests have been made in connection with the abduction of Yale Yee.

According to Southfield police spokesman Cpl. John Hood, it is unusual for a city to have so many abductions within such a short period of time. He said police have no theories on the sudden rise in that type crime.

Police patrols at the malls have been increased he said, in an effort to reduce this type of crime.
