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Dean: Power does corrupt

 With several dozen students picketing outside former White House chief counsel John W. Dean delivered an informal talk to 2,500 persons at Oakland University Tuesday evening.
 The protest was formed because the contracted fee offered Dean was comprised in part of student activities money. The angered group, tagged "Students Against Dean" felt that the student body had been abused by the university's decision to sponsor "a man who has gained notoriety through a public scandal."
 Dean entered the Sports and Recreation Building 25 minutes late, holding the hand of his attractive wife Mau-

reen. When the deeply tanned Dean assumed his position at the lectern, Maureen sat at his side in a position well familiar to viewers of the televised Watergate hearings.
 "Mo" was in a blue and orange striped dress which was hemmed a few inches below her knees. Her blonde hair was pulled tautly back. The immaculate grooming for which she has become known was very much in evidence as Mrs. Dean attentively listened to her husband.

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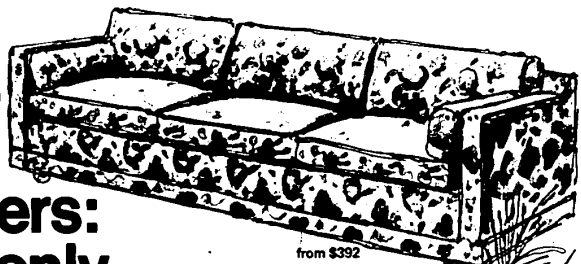
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
