

Ferndale edges Southfield, 53-51

If close basketball games make a coach sweat, then Southfield High coach Don Kaump really gave his Right Guard a workout last week. Southfield was involved in two close games. Ferndale High edged the Blue Jays, 53-51, in a Southeastern Michigan Association game on Friday. Last Tuesday, Southfield nipped non-league Wyandotte, 53-54.

Southfield and Ferndale played to a 13-13 draw after one quarter, but the Jays fell behind by five (27-22) at half-time and couldn't quite come back. Southfield outscored Ferndale, 23-26, in the second half.

Southfield's Steve Lowery scored a basket with five seconds left in the

game to bring the Jays as close as they ever got.

Tom Smith, Ferndale's 6-5 center, led all scorers with 23 points on 10 field goals and three of six foul shots. Greg Patterson added 15 points for the winners.

Southfield's Bill Phillips, a 6-4 center, fired in 21 points on eight field goals and five of six free throws. Rick Wieland and Jeff McCall scored 11 and seven points respectively for the Jays.

Ferndale made 22 of 32 field goal attempts for 69 per cent. Southfield shot 29 per cent — 20 of 73 attempts from the floor.

Ferndale outrebounded Southfield,

42-38. Phillips grabbed 24 rebounds for Southfield. Stuen was high for Ferndale with 17.

Against Wyandotte, Southfield's Eliot Rosen made the first free throw in a one-on-one situation with just two seconds left to give the Jays the one-point victory.

Phillips scored 16 points and matched 15 rebounds. Rosen added 11 points and Lowery 10. Mike Herman scored 22 points for Wyandotte.

A big third quarter helped Southfield win. The Jays outscored Wyandotte, 18-10, that quarter and went into the final quarter leading, 42-40.

Southfield, now 6-10 overall and 4-4 in the SMA, plays next at Bloomfield Hills Andover on Tuesday (Feb. 18) at 8 p.m. The Jays play at Royal Oak Kimball on the following Friday (Feb. 21) in an SMA contest.

Lathrup tankers sink Dondero

Southfield-Lathrup outswam Royal Oak Dondero, 118-51, in a Metro Suburban Association meet last Thursday. The victory lifted Lathrup to 9-3 overall and 3-1 in the MSA.

Lathrup's Buck Crowthwaite set a pool record in the 100-yard butterfly with a 55.5 clocking. Crowthwaite also swam on the winning 200 medley and 400 freestyle relays.

"We're swimming very well now," said Lathrup coach Pete Biglin. "I was apprehensive at the beginning of the season—didn't want to say what we were going to do. But now I feel we have a chance to take third in the league if we can beat Bloomfield Hills Lahser (in the MSA league meet)."

"The kids are starting to come down now, starting to drop their times. They're not swimming morning practices anymore. We're more or less into our taper."

North Farmington beat Westland John Glenn, 107-65, in a Northwest Suburban League meet last Thursday. North is 8-7 overall and 4-0 in the NSL.

North's Jordan Hatch won the 200 freestyle (1:05.5) and the 100 freestyle (50.1). Mark Holcomb won the 200 IM (2:11.0) and the 500 free (5:09.5). Coach Pat Duthe hopes his Raiders can repeat as NSL champions.

"Knock on wood, but it looks like we should go all the way now," Duthe said. "We have a meet with Garden City East on Thursday (Feb. 20) and they're not in real good shape this year."

"I swam well, I have no complaints in that department," said Harding, whose team is 6-4 overall and 1-1 in the SMA. "I was very afraid of the flu. We hadn't been touched by it until this point. Possibly, Beard could have given us two points in the breaststroke and two more points in the first relay."

Birmingham Seaholm stopped Farmington Harrison, 94-78, in a non-league meet. The loss was Harrison's fourth against 10 wins.

Harrison's Jeff Homacek was the meet's only double winner, taking the 100 freestyle (1:51.4) and the 100 breaststroke. Seaholm's Steve Kratt set a pool record in the 200 IM with a 2:02.5 time.

"Our kids swam very well, but the decisions went to the other team on the close races," said Harrison coach Mark Holdridge.

Bloomfield Hills Andover took Farmington High, 125-47, in an Inter Lakes League meet. Farmington is 5-11 overall.

Andover won all 11 events. Farmington got seconds from Paul Chuba, 2:29.7 in the 200 IM; Bill Bowman, 1:22.0 points in diving, and Mark Tompkins, 5:31.4 in the 500 freestyle.

Farmington coach Jack Merritt picked off Bowman as his Summer of the Meet. Earlier last week, Ferndale High beat Farmington, 111-62, in a non-league meet.
