Council member Joan Dudley also objected.

She said she was concerned about placing commercial establishments in industrial areas. It makes patred difficult at night.

Mrs. Dudley also objected to another restaurant in the area.

"I don't want my city to look like Woodward Avenue." Mrs. Dudley said. It would be harmful to the city to have an "oversaturation" of restaurants.
