

Marriage still in style

Despite free love and the high divorce rate, marriage is still booming in Oakland County.

Over the last 20 years, the number of people willing to pay \$5 to "make it legal"has risen about eight percent per thousand, according to state statistics.

In 1974, however, there was a slight 419 marriage license decrease as compared to 1973 when 9,267 were registered. But this is not seen as significant by Naomi Burch of the Oakland County Clerk's Office.

"People are just as enthusiastic about marriage as they've always been," said Mrs. Burch who has been with the county 20 years.

And to get prospective newlyweds off' to the right start, they're given a gift pack of aspirin, hair shampoo, laundry detergent and baby powder when applying for a marriage license in Oakland County:

But, they also get two to three odds that sometime in the future, they might be across the aisle—in the clerk's office filing for divorce.

Although the marriage rate is going up, the divorce rate is climbing faster. Until 1966, for every two marriage licenses, one divorce was filed. But, in 1967, the rate jumped to two out of three marriages ending in divorce.

Despite this, Mrs. Burch said people are still in a hurry to get married. She thinks there has been a slight increase in those who want to waive the three-day waiting period before marriage.

"They come in with the \$5, a medical certificate and proof of age wanting to get married right away," she said.

But, if Mrs. Burch isn't convinced both people are of age, further proof is requested. This is happening more frequently according to Mrs. Burch.

"In June, we get many kids right out of high school who are not yet 18. They still want to get married even though many young people are living together today," Mrs. Burch said.

Also, in the younger age group, many girls are now keeping their maiden names. As far as the county is concerned that's OK according to Mrs. Burch.
