Fleming holds a masters of fine arts degree in painting from Cranbrook Academy of Art and is the former head of the art department at Kingwood Academy of Art in New York.

His work is in many corporate and private collections including General Motors, Kresge International, and Michigan Blue Cross Blue Shield.

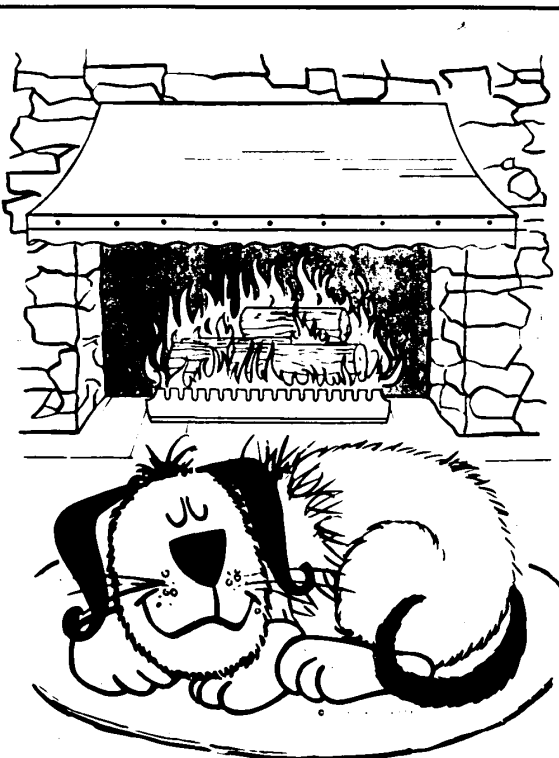
