Elaine Harrison, a teacher in the learning resource center at Fairview, said the student apparently had inhaled the food.  
"I saw him gasping and choking and attempted to help him by patting him on the back and then take it out with my fingers. When it didn't come out, I sent a teacher's aide to get somebody," she said.  
It was then that she remembered a newspaper article posted in the teacher's lounge and tried the squeeze. By the time she the aide came back, it was out," she said.

## Interlochen students will give concert

**FARMINGTON**—The Interlochen Arts Academy Orchestra will give a concert 8 p.m. Saturday, March 15, at Harrison High School.  
This appearance, sponsored by the Farmington Arts Council and Farmington Public Schools is part of "Interlochen Outreach" activities supported this year by the Michigan Council for the Arts.  
The tour's evening program includes Smetana's Overture to "The Bartered Bride," George Gershwin's "An American in Paris" and the Symphony No. 5 by Shostakovich.  
Guest conductor for the tour is Fredrick Pennell. He will be assisted by the academy's resident conductor, Byron Hanson.  
Pennell is conductor in residence at the University of Miami. He was the founder and long-term conductor of the Eastman Wind Ensemble and was two-year associate conductor of the Minneapolis Symphony.  
Hanson, Interlochen faculty member for 30 years, is also conductor of the academy band, associate conductor of the Northwestern Michigan Symphony of Traverse City and conductor of the Grand Traverse Chorale.  
Members of the orchestra come from 25 states, the District of Columbia, Canada, Japan and Korea. Michigan's representation is highest with 29 out of 95 players.

## OCC will sponsor women's celebration

**FARMINGTON HILLS**—The Oakland Community College's Women center will sponsor a variety of activities Wednesday, March 12 in celebration of International Women's Day. Activities begin at 9 a.m. with registration and free coffee and donuts in the main entrance of J building.  
From 9-11 a.m. female folk guitarists will entertain in the lower level of J building. Margaret Skon, co-founder of the National Black Feminist Organization and contributing writer to Ms. magazine, will speak 10-11 a.m.  
Two activities held from 11 a.m. noon include workshops on the Detroit Feminist Credit Union and Chicago women and their struggle.  
An international meal will be available 11 a.m. - 1 p.m. in J-409 and J-404. It will include home cooked dishes from Greece, Italy, Vietnam, Jamaica and Mexico. Local women musicians will perform during lunch.

**Brotherthon hits proposal**  
FARMINGTON—Republican State Rep. Wilbur Brotherthon has opposed a "Do it or else" proposal for campaign financing put forth by Common Cause.  
"I have no objection to any sort of reform proposals which will increase public confidence in elected officials and which will be fair to all concerned parties," the legislator said.  
"But a recent do it or else proposal by Common Cause does not merit consideration by either the legislature or the voters. They have said that if the legislature does not enact it, they will put it on the ballot by a petition drive." The main problem with the Common Cause proposal is that it would permit Michigan's two largest special interest groups, the UAW and the AFL-CIO, to finance up to 60 percent of a candidates' campaign while other groups would be severely limited, he said.  
Brotherthon said he supports the political reform measure passed last year by the legislature which requires reporting of nearly all contributions. bans multiple committees and provides penalties for non-compliance.
