A talented young pianist from Farmington will present his own compositions along with those of Bach, Beethoven, Brahms, Scott Joplin and Dello Joia at 7 p.m. Sunday in University Hills Church, Farmington Road, south of Twelve Mile Road.

Seventeen-year-old Tim Doot, who has studied music since age five, has won several awards since that time. Most recently he earned a \$100 scholarship for competition in the Birmingham Musicale competition this year.

He is preparing for the Michigan Federation of Music Scholarship competition set for this spring. Winners will play with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

Besides studying classical music and composing, Doot also is inter-

ested in popular and rock music and has formed his own rock group which performs at school dances.

A longtime member of school choirs and bands, he was involved in the production of "West Side Story" at North Farmington High School where he is a senior and a member of the National Honor Society.

He is studying under Lawrence LaGore a member of the faculty at Marygrove College.
