

Residents honored as men of the year

SOUTHFIELD—Arnold and Norman Michlin will be honored as "Marshall Suburban Men of the Year" at the annual Israel Bond dinner-dance of the Detroit Louis Marshall Suburban Lodge and Chapter at 7 p.m. Sunday at Congregation Shaareh Zedek.

Both Arnold and Norman have been active members of B'Nai B'rith since 1954 and were pioneers in the Detroit Marshall Lodge during its formative years.

Norman, a Southfield resident, was chairman of the blood bank for five years. He served and chaired almost every committee of the lodge, and in 1968 received the William B. Chapman Memorial Award. He was elected president of the lodge in 1967.

Arnold, a Farmington resident, has been a member of the Marshall Lodge since 1954. He has been on the Michigan Regional Advisory Board from 1967 to the present.

He also was president of the Franklin Forest and Fairway Subdivision Association, and helped organize the League of Subdivisions Association.

In the 1960s he co-authored a patent to deodorize ammonia for use in the white paint industry. The product is known as diolan.

Arnold also is president of the Michigan Industrial Finishing Corporation and secretary of the Michlin Chemical Corporation. He has served as a scientific fair judge for several years.

Norman is a member of the American Veterans Committee and a number of other civic, charitable and business trade organizations.

HE IS A board member of the Michigan Regional Advisory Board of the Anti-Defamation League and is ADL chairman for the Marshall Suburban Lodge.

The Michlin brothers are both World War II veterans. In 1947, during Israel's struggle for independence, they organized materials for the people of Israel, and have been nationally recognized for their contributions.

The dinner-dance, which will celebrate the 25th anniversary of State of Israel Bonds, will feature entertainer Emil Cohen.

Cities extend registration

Unregistered voters in the Farmington School District who want to vote in the April 29 millage election may take advantage of extended sign-up hours in Farmington and Farmington Hills.

At stake in the special election will be three issues.

Proposition one is a request for four mills for 10 years to raise the district's operating level to that of the 1973-74 school year.

Proposition two is an alternate proposal which would provide two additional mills for 10 years to the budget to maintain the district at its current level for the coming school year.

Proposition three is a request for one mill. The funds would be earmarked for new textbooks, replacement equipment and building repair. The proposal carries a two-year limit.

RESIDENTS of Farmington who are at least 18 years old may register to vote from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday at the city offices. Hours are extended until 8 p.m. Friday, March 14, and 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. March 22.

Farmington Hills residents may register during regular city hall hours of 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday or until 8 p.m. Friday, March 14, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. March 22 or from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. March 31.

In addition, representatives from the Farmington clerk's office will be at Farmington High School on March 20 to register students.

The Farmington Hills clerk's office will have representatives at Harrison High School on March 17 and at North Farmington High School on March 18.

The final day for voter registration is March 31.
