

## Successful search

 cers joined Farmington Hills police in the continuing search for clues.  
 "We don't know where the homicide took place," said Public Safety Director Ronald Hollo.

**WISHED DISCUSSION** among officers at the scene indicated, however, that the child is believed to have been brought to the pond alive and that a struggle took place in the desolate field, located west of Halstead Road midway between Twelve and Thirteen Mile roads.

At one point in the search for clues two police helicopters were brought in to spot roadways and vehicle tracks.

The area was sealed off Thursday by police. A road block on Halstead checked traffic on the road.  
 Early Friday afternoon, Detroit po-

lice lab technicians combed the site.

**THE FARMINGTON HILLS** fire department was called to the scene at about midday to begin draining the pond which was about 200 yards west of Halstead.

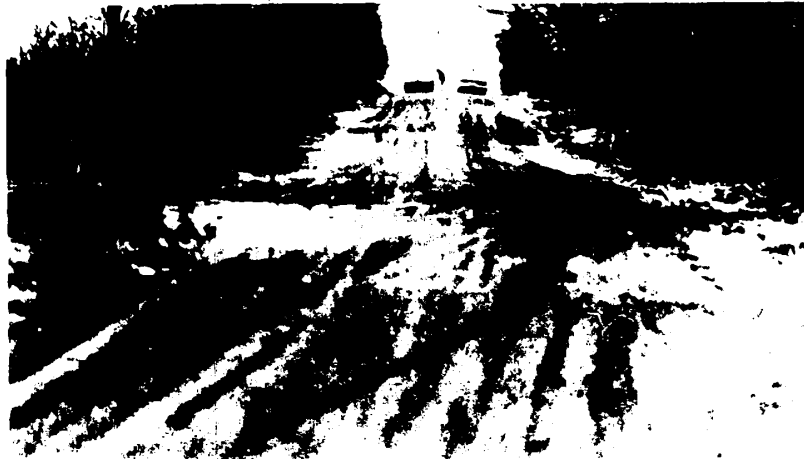
Teams of officers continued to search the area in the afternoon.

Late Friday afternoon police marked tracks in the area so that plaster casts could be made.

Heading up the search activities at the site was Farmington Hills Capt. Russell Conway.

Detroit police said that the child had left home Tuesday night to stay with a friend. On Wednesday afternoon, an aunt who went to the school to pick up Kelly learned that the girl had been absent.

Mrs. Curley then notified police.
