## City to tackle summer weeds

**FARMINGTON HILLS**—Armed with a stronger ordinance, the city will get a head start on busting down the dandelions and ragweed of summer.

requires property owners to cut weeds by June 1.

If the property owner does not take care of the cutting, the city will do so and charge the owner.

The ordinance is aimed primarily at owners of undeveloped land. Previously, cutting was not required until July 1.

Spencer said the addition of a full-scale life insurance package continues Auto Club's history of meeting the needs of members through expanded services.


Homeowner's insurance has been available to the Auto Club membership since 1971, and homeowner's insurance has been offered since 1972.


