City to tackle summer weeds

FARMINGTON HILLS—Armed with a stronger ordinance, the city will get a head start on busting down the dandelions and ragweed of summer.

The amendment to the noxious weeds ordinance, unanimously approved by the city council Monday night,

requires property owners to cut weeds by June 1.

If the property owner does not take care of the cutting, the city will do so and charge the owner.

The ordinance is aimed primarily at owners of undeveloped land.

Previously, cutting was not required until July 1.
