

# JWF launches fund drive April 9

Detroit's Allied Jewish Campaign-Israel Emergency Fund will be launched at its 1975 opening dinner at 7 p.m. Wednesday at the Adat Shalom Synagogue, 3901 Middlebelt Road in Farmington.

Local campaign chairmen are Richard Sloan of Birmingham and Arthur Howard of Southfield.

The campaign benefits nearly 50 local, national and overseas humanitarian agencies. The United Jewish Appeal (UJA) is the major beneficiary of the campaign which is the annual drive of the Jewish Welfare Federation (JWF).

Frank R. Lautenberg, general chairman of the national UJA will speak at the dinner. Lautenberg became chairman last December at a national con-

ference in New York. He previously served UJA as national chairman during its emergency campaign after the 1973 Yom Kippur War.

Lautenberg is also governor of the American Jewish Committee and founder of the Lautenberg Center for General and Tumor Immunology (cancer research) of the Medical School at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem.

## Lecture explores history

Man's presence in Oakland County from prehistory to Victorian times will be the subject of a slide-lecture, "Oakland County: From Stone Age to Stone Age," by archaeologist Charles Martinez at 8 p.m. Monday, April 14, in St. Mary's College, Commerce and Orchard Lake Roads, Orchard Lake.

The program will be presented in the auditorium-gymnasium. The Orchard Lake Scientific and Historical Society and the Aquinas Academy of St. Mary's College are sponsoring Martinez.

Martinez, a photo-journalist from West Bloomfield, has spent the last decade writing and photographing archaeological and historical sites in the United States and the Caribbean.

Since 1966 he has compiled extensive background information from early diaries and letters of Oakland County pioneers, particularly those who settled West Bloomfield and Apple Island in Orchard Lake. He is

currently preparing a history covering the facts and fables of Apple Island.

Martinez, an executive board member and past president of the Michigan Archaeological Society, recently was assistant site director and photographer on the Renaissance Center Archaeological Project in downtown Detroit, believed to be one of the largest and most successful historic archaeological salvage excavations in the United States.

Elsewhere in Michigan, Martinez has worked on excavations at Fort Michilimackinac in Mackinac City, the Brownstown Reserve in Gibraltar, and Forts Wayne and Lernout in De-

troit. He has lectured widely in recent years on "Prehistoric Man in the Great Lakes Region," as well as the "Impact of the French and British Colonial Empires in Michigan."

St. Mary's College is part of the Orchard Lake Schools educational complex, the other schools being St. Cyril and Methodius Seminary and St. Mary's Preparatory, all located in West Bloomfield Township.

**BLOOMFIELD HILLS**—Two seniors at the Academy of the Sacred Heart have qualified as finalists in the 1975 National Merit Scholarship competition.

Selection of national merit scholars is under way and between mid-March and early May approximately 3,400 finalists will be notified they have won merit scholarships.

In 1975 approximately 14,000 finalists will compete for about 1,000 one-time \$1,000 scholarships and 2,400 four-year merit scholarships to be awarded.

### Scouts offer activity ideas

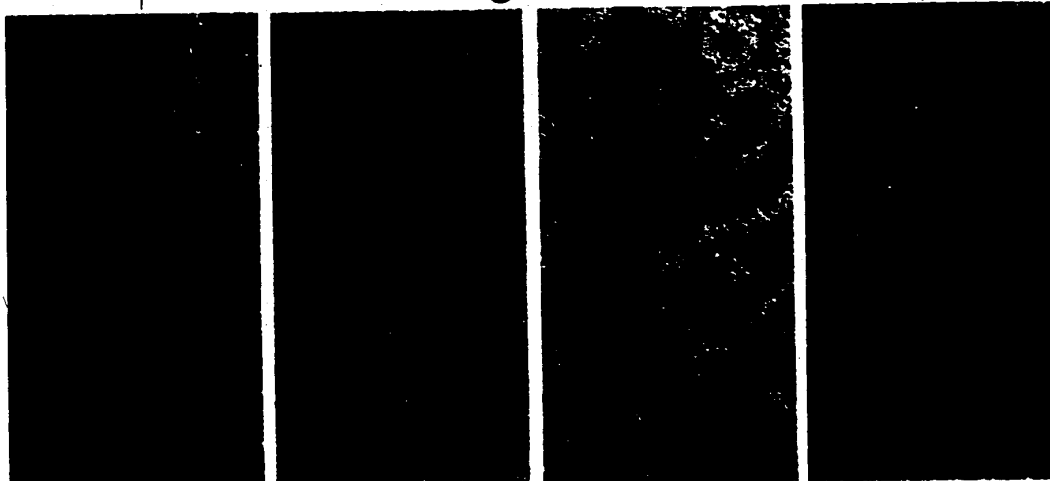
For people bored with winter and yearning for spring, the Northern Oakland County Girl Scout Council's 1975 Summer Activities booklet is available for making summer plans.
